PURPOSE

RERSEDER The purpose of this Academic Operating Policy and Procedure (AOP) in the Procedure (AOP) in are understanding and present a standardized approach to matters relating to veterans' academic status.

REVIEW

This Academic Operating Policy and Procedure (AOP) will be viewed every four years or whenever circumstances require an earlier review by the Associate Too of Academic Affairs (APAA) with recommendations for revision presented to the Provost and Vecutive Vice President.

POLICY/PROCEDURE

- 1. Students receiving educational benefits from the Department of Veterans Affairs must meet the academic standards as specified in Mississippi State University's (MSU) Academic Operating Policy AOP 12.16 Academic Suspension and Dismissal. The povisions of AOP 12.16 determine the student's academic eligibility to enroll in future semesters or the requirement to be placed on academic suspension or dismissal. This policy also specifies when a student is eligible to re-enroll after a period of suspension or dismissal and applies to all undergraduate students including those who receive VA benefits.
- 2. A student's continued entitlement to the Department of Veterans Affairs educational benefits is determined as follows: If a student's convative average falls below the acceptable level as specified in AOP 12.16, he or she will be placed on "first probation to receive VA benefits." If during the first probation semester, a student does not improve his reder cumulative GPA, VA benefits will be suspended at the end of the semester. If a student's cumulative GPA in proves but an acceptable level is still not achieved, a "second probation to receive VA benefits" see will be allowed. If the standards of progress are not achieved at the end of the second probation Supester, VA benefits will be suspended. Students may not receive further benefits until approved by
- 3. Based on VA rules and regulations, students receiving VA educational benefits will receive benefits only for courses that apply toward a degree program. NOTE: Any change in student status, such as drops/adds, major changes or withdrawals from the University, must be reported to the Veterans Administration Supervisor.
